

"To our UCC, from concerned Tanjayanons, with love"

Though the "Tanjayanon 45 day generous challenge fund drive" has ended, much of the work is really just beginning. So what was this all about?

The UCC or Urgent Care Clinic, was put in operation about 2 years ago by the City of Tanjay. It's services are free, and is manned round-the-clock by a group of doctors and nurses paid by the City. Being a clinic, it cannot respond to all medical cases, so it sends the critical cases to the Provincial Hospital in Dumaguete by ambulance.

Beside it is the Tanjay Rural Health Unit #1 which is run by the National Government. The structure was built a few years earlier through donations of the late Dr Batiacilla and his Rotarians. There is another Tanjay RHU #2 in Palanas, north of Tanjay. It serves more the barrio folk. The recent fund drive was mainly to augment the requirements of UCC, and partly of the RHUs.



The above photos, plus commentary and tables on the next 5 pages, highlight the recent activities, including some facts as an answer to points taken up in the internet regarding the fund drive. Last few pages show the list of donors and accounting of purchased/donated items and supplies. One such donated box of supplies is shown in small photo above. Upper middle and right photos are a before/after shots of patient room where a new ceiling electric fan is shown. Group photo is at the Mayor's office where the second turnover occurred, as witnessed and attested by UCC and RHU reps, and one of the "stewards", Badingding Gil. Other photos above show refrigerator for medicine storage, and an ID'd nebulizer, and boxes of electric fans.

How and when did it all start?

It is not a stretch of imagination to say that it started years ago in 1984, when a close-knit group of Tanjayanons started meeting periodically in the house of Cente and Benny Reyes in Los Angeles. Tanjayanons being what they are – happy, hard-working, cohesive, and witty – it did not take long for the core members to organize a get-together. The first event had to be hosted at a guest house of the Dodger Stadium, since the response was terrific and about 350 Tanjayanons and family members and friends appeared, many of whom flew/drove in from the East coast, Chicago, San Francisco, etc.

This gave way to the formation of the Tanjay Association, USA, or TAUSA for short. Contrary to recent reports, it has a formal structure, with by-laws and constitution. Unfortunately, there was no internet or computer file storage system then, and the original documents cannot be located. However, one of the by-laws is remembered clearly by many when it comes to a definition on who can be a member: "those born in Tanjay, those with one parent born in Tanjay, those who grew up and/or spent a few years in Tanjay, and those married to a Tanjayanon, and have no regrets". It is non exclusive. The first president was Pabby Utsurum of Dumaguete. The president and administration serves for 2 years.

Over the past 25 years, TAUSA has persevered, holding the traditional Señor Santiago fiesta celebration every end of July, with an informal "tapok-tapok" vespers party on Friday, a formal dinner dance in Saturday, a mass and picnic on Sunday. And many times during the year, there are those parties and get-togethers. But not all activities have been social.

The Ang Tanjayanon Newsletter was launched in the early 1990's. It originally was printed as hardcopy, now is electronic.

With the advent of the internet, Iking Cariño in SF launched the Tanjay website. And communications between members became easier especially after Bino Guerrero in Cebu, who had already set up an extensive YahooGroups listing of Tanjayanons from all over the world, allowed it's use for all of TAUSA.

Tanjayanons in the East Coast, Chicago, Toronto, formed "chapters". TAUSA is therefore even more international.

Other administrations and chapters have had projects that involve education, or fundraising for specific projects, such as the toilet project of the East coast chapter for Palanas. In 1997, there was the "Balik-Tanjay", where a large group of Tanjayanons came home to visit in a coordinated schedule. Ten years later, the 2007 version was even grander, which was coordinated with the opening of the Tanjay City Library, the blessing of Tanjay RHU#1 by the widow of Dr Batiacilla, a number of medical missions, etc.

Over the years, TAUSA has seen members come and go. New immigrants from Tanjay have taken over more actively, sometimes with the officers being informatively assigned to their roles. Perhaps membership dues may not have been religiously collected, nor have the lost by-laws, whatever they were, have been strictly enforced. But it really doesn't matter.

For it is not the by-laws of an organization that make good things happen.

It is the people within, and even those outside the organization.

The real credit goes to the Tanjayanons themselves – the typical Tanjayanon spirit, the distinctive Tanjayanon concern for their folks back home. So now, let us continue the good work.

The original fund drive spearheaded by Braddock Calumpang over three months ago targeted the purchase of an autoclave for the UCC. A significant portion of the donors were local Tanjayanons. The Mayor later announced they would purchase the item, in addition to other needs such as a generator. The momentum of the fund drive brought us much over the original target. We have to identify other needs to spend the extra funding on, to the satisfaction of donors. We should be ready to again open our pocketbooks for other worthy projects. Already, Dr Bert Sanchez has pledged a yearly stipend for education.

For the the US based, there already is a tax-exempt venue for donations.

For those who have other plans, TAUSA members or otherwise, we can coordinate, for Tanjayanons should be all one. If your plans call for formation of other groups, so be it; it is a free country. But do not discourage the present on-going efforts. Why form another organization or two? To help Tanjayanons in other ways? You first have to raise a million just to legitimize it. Perhaps because it is a loose organization, TAUSA has survived this long. Since we are all for the greater good of Tanjay, let us not be divisive. Viva Señor Santiago!
